José A. Moura-Neto, MD, MBA, MA, FASN, FRCP (Lon), FACP

José A. Moura-Neto is a Brazilian nephrologist with a background that integrates internal medicine, nephrology, kidney transplantation, and health management. He is currently President of the Brazilian Society of Nephrology and serves as a Professor of Internal

Medicine at the Bahiana School of Medicine and Public Health in Salvador, Bahia.

Moura-Neto earned his medical degree from the Bahiana School of Medicine and Public Health in Salvador, Brazil, in 2011, followed by residencies in Internal Medicine (HFA-RJ, 2012-2014) and Nephrology at the University Hospital of Rio de Janeiro State University (UERJ, 2014-2016). His training continued with a fellowship in Kidney Transplantation at UERJ (2016-2017), and in 2017, he became a certified nephrologist through the Brazilian Society of Nephrology's (SBN) examination process.

Furthering his commitment to healthcare leadership, Moura-Neto completed an MBA in Health Management from Fundação Getúlio Vargas (FGV-RJ) with top academic honors (2014-2016), and earned a Master's in Administration from FGV (EBAPE-FGV, 2016-2017).

Throughout his career, Moura-Neto has made significant contributions to nephrology, publishing scientific articles (i10 index = 16, 1,006 citations as of October 2024) and editing books. These include "Renal Replacement Therapy: Controversies and Future Trends" (2018) and its sequel, "Renal Replacement Therapy 2" (2019, in Portuguese), both addressing innovations in dialysis and renal replacement therapies. In 2021, he co-edited "Nephrology Worldwide" with Claudio Ronco and José Divino-Filho, a landmark publication by Springer Nature featuring contributions from around 330 nephrologists across 51 countries (<u>https://nephrologyworldwide.com/</u>). His more recent works include co-editing "Complications in Dialysis", "Issues in Kidney Disease", "Condutas em Nefrologia Clínica e Diálise", and "Nefrologia Essencial", the latter two published in Portuguese by the Brazilian Society of Nephrology.

Moura-Neto serves as Associate Editor for Blood Purification and Visual Abstract Editor for JASN, CJASN, and Kidney360. His contributions have been recognized through fellowships with the American Society of Nephrology (FASN), the American College of Physicians (FACP), and the Royal College of Physicians (FRCP). He is also a board member of the International Society for Hemodialysis (ISHD) and collaborated to the KDIGO guidelines.

In 2024, Moura-Neto chaired the 32nd Brazilian Congress of Nephrology—the largest in the Society's history which saw extensive collaboration with global nephrology organizations, including KDIGO, SLANH, the Portuguese Society of Nephrology, and the International Society of Nephrology (ISN). Since 2023, he is a member of the ISN Latin America Regional Board, where he has focused on fostering stronger connections between Brazilian nephrology and the international community. He also integrated the Local Organizing Working Group for the 2024 World Congress of Nephrology, held in Buenos Aires, Argentina.
