I live and breathe the values and mission of the International Society of Nephrology. I am passionate about improving global kidney care and reducing inequalities for the men, women and children served by the ISN

Working as a consultant nephrologist at Barts Health London, I serve an ethnically diverse and socially disadvantaged population. As a leader in the field of health

inequalities in kidney care, I have co-authored two national reports providing a strategic plan for the UK kidney community to reduce inequalities in kidney care. I chair the London Kidney Network Health inequalities group, successfully commissioning the first ever quantification of inequalities in kidney care in London. In my role as the national clinical advisor for chronic kidney disease (CKD) in England, I have led innovative service transformation for the prevention and treatment of CKD.

I am also a global kidney doctor, with first-hand experience of working in a wide range of clinical and research environments. Working in northern Australia in 2005 with an indigenous population exposed me to stark and unacceptable inequalities in healthcare. Following this, I spent a year volunteering in clinical nephrology in rural Uganda, providing medical education and service delivery to build capacity in line with the ISN's global mission.

Subsequently, I have spent 3.5 years working in Blantyre, Malawi where I was the only nephrologist for 16 million people. I initiated new, comprehensive and sustainable nephrology services including acute and chronic haemo and peritoneal dialysis, treating acute kidney injury, prevention of CKD and delivering a high quality research output.

I initiated an ISN Sister Centre partnership between units in Malawi and Barts Health UK - in 2019 we were awarded the ISN Schreier prize for best sister centre partnership.

I have been a leader in the ISN at multiple different levels, chairing both the Young Nephrologists Committee and the Educational Ambassador Committee. As a member of the ISN core programmes committee and the Western Europe regional board, I have actively participated in regional and global innovation for kidney care, exemplified when I helped initiate the collaboration between DOPPS and ISN research teams to assess the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on global kidney care. I am a steering committee member for the Emerging Leaders Programme, supporting the development of the next generation of ISN leaders.

My unique strengths are the breadth of my global clinical and research career, expertise and leadership in kidney health inequalities and my leadership within the ISN to date. My career passion is to identify and reduce unjustifiable and unacceptable inequalities in kidney care - in Western Europe and globally.

I am very excited to collaborate with colleagues from across Europe to advance kidney care and support the mission of the ISN. I am proud to be an active and innovative member of the ISN family – I will be so for the rest of my career.
